## MEET CONDITIONS

### GENERAL CONDITIONS

1. The meet will be held under ASA Laws & Regulations and ASA Technical Rules of Racing and has been licensed at Level 3 by the ASA so that times achieved can qualify for county and regional competitions.
2. **The meet is jointly run by Bristol Penguin Olympic Swimming Club (Gloucestershire ASA) and Keynsham Amateur Swimming Club (Somerset ASA). The meet promoter is Chris Metcalfe, 8 Coronation Avenue, Keynsham, Bristol, BS31 2PT; e.mail: kascmeets@outlook.com.**
3. Any situation not covered by these conditions will either be referred to the lead referee or meet promoter. The outcome of any decision will be based on ASA Law or Technical Rules or in the spirit of fairness and equity and will be announced accordingly.

### ENTRIES – INDIVIDUAL EVENTS

4. **Keynsham Amateur Swimming Club will handle the entries. All entries must be submitted as a HyTek entry file, available to download from the website: [www.keynshamswimmingclub.co.uk](http://www.keynshamswimmingclub.co.uk), or on request from [kascmeets@outlook.com](mailto:kascmeets@outlook.com). Details for payment of meet fees will be provided on receipt of an entry.**
5. All competitors must be British Swimming Registered and must be category 2 members of a club affiliated to the ASA, WASA, or SASA.
6. The entry fee is £6 per event.
7. Age groups for the meet are based on age on the 10<sup>th</sup> March 2019.
8. Entries to an event will only be accepted from a swimmer who has NOT achieved a short course, or converted long course time faster than that event's upper qualification time, for their age and gender, since 1<sup>st</sup> January 2018. Swimmers who achieve a faster time than the upper qualification time between submission of entry and the weekend of the meet will be permitted to compete.
9. Poolside passes are £10 each for the whole meet, and must be requested at least two weeks before the meet. A club with one or more swimmers needing assistance to compete will be issued one poolside pass free of charge. Passes are transferable, but we ask clubs to ensure they are only held by ASA members with an up to date DBS check. Passes must be worn at all times when poolside or in swimmer-only areas. Clubs will normally be restricted to a maximum of five poolside passes, but a club should contact the promoter if this will be insufficient to manage their swimmers.

10. Please submit entries by 10pm on Monday 28<sup>th</sup> January 2019. Entries will be accepted after this until 1<sup>st</sup> March, subject to space being available, and without disadvantaging those entries received by 28<sup>th</sup> January.
11. Entries will be accepted on a first-come first-served basis. The meet will close early once as many entries as can be accommodated are received.
12. If on the 28<sup>th</sup> January insufficient entries have been received for the meet to be financially viable, the meet will be cancelled, and all entry fees refunded.
13. Short course (25m) entry times or converted long course times should be submitted. Swimmers with no entry time for an event are encouraged to submit a realistic estimate.
14. Entries will be held on a computer solely for the purposes of this competition and consent, as required by the Data Protection Act 2018, and in line with GDPR 2018, to the holding of personal information on computer will be deemed to have been given by the submission of the entry. Personal data will be available for inspection during the meet on application to the promoters.
15. No refunds will be made to competitors who withdraw after advice of acceptance unless in extenuating circumstances and at the discretion of the promoter. Where a swimmer is injured, the head coach of their club should contact the promoter to confirm this.

#### ENTRIES – RELAY EVENTS

16. Relay entries must be submitted using the HyTek entry file.
17. The entry fee is £6 per relay team per event
18. The age groups for the medley relay are 9/10, 12 and under, and open. An individual swimmer must be a member of one medley relay team only.
19. The 10x50 metres mixed cannon will include one girl and one boy in each of the following age groups: 9 years, 10 and under, 11 and under, 12 and under, open. The order of swimmers is at the team's discretion.
20. Clubs are welcome to enter more than one team to each relay event. Please submit an estimated entry time for each team.
21. Relay team members must fulfil the age and gender requirements of the event, and also be entered for at least one individual event during the meet.
22. Clubs must submit the list of swimmers for their relay team(s) before the start of the corresponding session.
23. No relay times will be submitted to rankings.

#### OFFICIALS

24. If possible, clubs are requested to provide a licensed official (or J1 trainee with

timekeeper competency signed off in their workbook) for every eight swimmers entered; entries will not be refused if this is not possible. The meet promoters will endeavour to recruit sufficient officials to meet the license requirements for each session; if this proves not to be possible for a session, times from that session will not be submitted to ASA rankings.

## THE COMPETITION

25. All events will be run on a Heat Declared Winner basis. Entries will be seeded into heats from submitted times; for each event the fastest eight swimmers in each age group will be in the same heat, with the remaining swimmers seeded purely by time, the slowest heats being swum first.
26. Medals will be given to the top six swimmers in each gender / age group category. The age groups are 9 years, 10 years, 11 years, 12 years, and 13+ years.
27. Swimmers achieving times faster than the upper qualification times will be eligible for medals; there won't be a "speeding ticket" system.
28. For each event the top six swimmers in each age group will be awarded points towards the top boy and top girl competitions, which will be awarded in each age category at the end of the meet.
29. There will be no requirement for swimmers to sign in.
30. All swimmers must report to marshalling when instructed to do so, or may be exclude from the event.
31. Swimmers who are unable to execute a competitive racing dive should start in the water.
32. Backstroke starting ledges will not be used at this meet.
33. A swimmer with a certificate of disability should present this to the lead referee before competing.
34. The referee may request swimmers to start races "over the top".

## CONDUCT DURING THE MEET

35. Spectator entry will be £4 for a single session, £10 for the weekend
36. In accordance with recommendations of the ASA, any persons wishing to use video, zoom or close-range photography, including mobile phones, are requested to focus on their own children as much as reasonably possible and to avoid including other children in images, particularly if those images are being shared on social media platforms. It is requested that all mobile phones are switched to silent during the competition, and that there is no flash photography at the start of each race.
37. Swimmers must be dry and wearing t-shirt, shorts and footwear before leaving poolside / the swimmers area.

38. The promoters, Keynsham Amateur Swimming Club, Bristol Penguin Olympic Swimming Club, nor Hutton Moor Leisure Centre can accept responsibility for any property that is lost, stolen or damaged.
39. All meet competitors and spectators must observe all safety precautions in operation at Hutton Moor Leisure Centre and follow any instructions given by Leisure Centre Staff.
40. For the duration of the meet, Team Managers and Coaches are responsible for the conduct of their swimmers.
41. Only those non-swimmers holding a poolside pass, volunteer pass, officials, and leisure centre staff are allowed poolside and the swimmer's area.
42. In extenuating circumstances, the referee has the right to make changes to the conditions on the day in order to ensure the smooth running of the meet.

#### AFTER THE MEET

43. Results will be made available to competing clubs and individual entrants at the end of the competition.
44. Times from individual events will be submitted to ASA rankings in accordance to conditions 23 and 24 above.
